# **Attendance**

A reminder that good attendance is also a key factor in how well your child will achieve at school. #### Homework

We know that family life is incredibly busy and time is precious and as such, have kept our homework expectations limited to areas that we know will help your child reach their potential. Please set aside a small amount of time to complete activities as listed below- it really will make a difference.

- Reception- Maths and English on Tapestry and weekly phonics sheet.
- Year 1- Maths on Purple Mash, spellings and three lots of reading at home.
- Year 2- TT Rockstars, spellings and three lots of reading at home.
- KS2-TT Rockstars, Reading Plus, spellings and three lots of reading at home.
