Christmas Activities



We have a number of festive activities coming up in school which we are all looking forward to.

Christmas tree – We have a real Christmas tree in the hall which has been decorated by Mrs Rifat Khan and some of our students.



Nativity show – Our Reception children have been practising very hard and are excited to showcase their nativity to parents and siblings in school. Reception parents, ***please arrive promptly.***
