## **Zones of Regulation**

As a school we have been doing lots of work around emotions and the strategies we need to manage them. We want our children to become adults that can solve conflict in a positive and calm manner, without overreacting or becoming angry and agitated. Things go wrong and we need to equip children with the skills they need to resolve difficulties!

We have decided to introduce an approach called 'Zones of Regulation'. Your child may have come home talking about what 'zone' they are in recently and we would like to invite you in to school to learn more about what this approach is and how it can help children regulate both at home and school. Miss Stephenson is leading on this work and will be holding two open events so that parents can find out more. The events are on Tuesday 4 November and Thursday 6 November at 8.45am.



## **Remembrance Day**

Children are welcome to wear poppies to show support for the Armed Forces Community. The poppy is a symbol of both Remembrance and a hope for a peaceful future. We have a limited supply of Poppies to wear- these will be sold on a first come, first served basis. Suggested donations are:

## **Dinner Money**

We are sorry to inform you that our provider of school meals has raised their prices in response to increasing food and labour costs. From 3 November, the new price for a school meal (Y3-6) will be £2.55 each day. For our 30-hour Nursery children, it will be £2.35 per day. Please do visit the council website to see if you are eligible for free school meals. It is sensible to do this regularly, especially if your circumstances have changed. ### **Outdoor Clothing**
