### **BBC Film Crew**

The BBC are running a news article about food in schools and the difficulties currently being faced in schools due to the rising costs of food and transport. We have been asked if the BBC can send a film crew at some point this week to film our lunches and speak to some children about their school dinners. We have been chosen as we are currently taking part in projects to help ensure that the quality of our food continues throughout the current financial crisis. They would also like to film a PE lesson and interview Mr. Mathie about the importance of sport and exercise in schools.

The first project is called 'Fix Our Food' where school dinners are monitored to see what children select and eat, and how much food is wasted. The second is the RiC project running throughout Bradford which looks at the overall health of the children – nutrition, sport, obesity levels etc. Our sports coach, Connor Mathie, is the lead on this project.

We are very excited to be taking part in this and we know our children will be enthusiastic about being on the TV!
