


Knowledge Organiser



A train is a connected line of rail-road cars pulled by an engine (locomotive) that travels on steel tracks to carry people or heavy goods over long distances.



A boat is a small vehicle that floats and moves on top of water, designed for recreation, fishing, or short trips



A bus is a very large motor vehicle designed to carry many people at once, much larger than a car or van.



A submarine is a special type of ship designed to travel and operate completely underwater for long periods.



An airplane (or plane) is a fast, flying vehicle with fixed wings and powerful engines that carries people and cargo through



A helicopter is a special type of aircraft that does not have wings like an airplane. Instead, it uses fast-spinning blades on top, called a rotor, to lift straight up, hover in one spot, and fly in any direction—even backward .

Literacy
