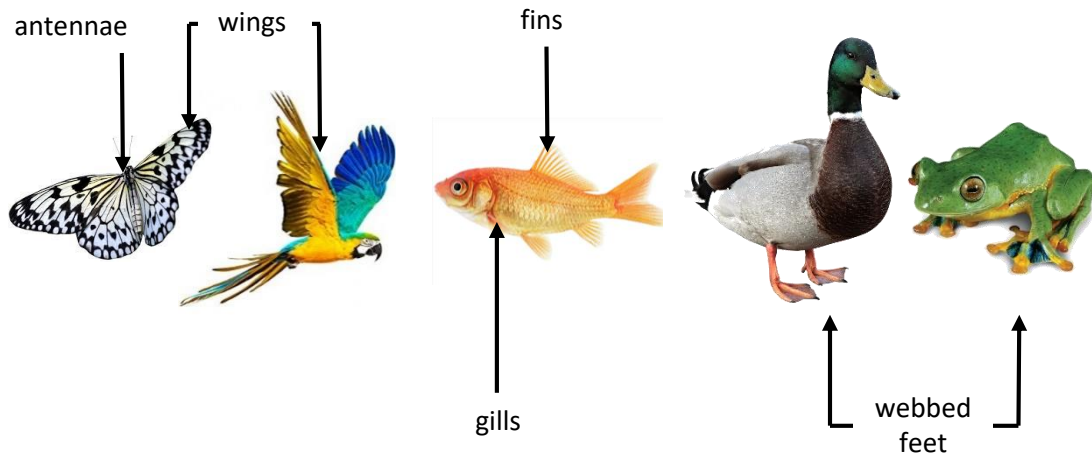


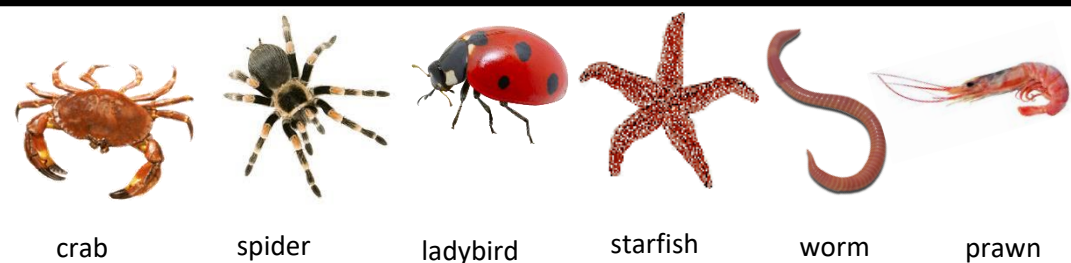
Science Year 1 Animals Including Humans

Bird	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> lays eggs has feathers 	<p>magpie</p> <p>hen</p> <p>duck</p> <p>penguin</p>
