Science



Rocks and Soil-In this unit, children will discover the different types of rocks and how they are formed. Children will compare and group rocks based on appearance and simple properties. Compare a region of the UK with a region in Europe, eg. local hilly area with Naples at sea level and has volcanoes.

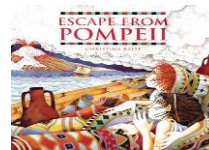
Have a brief introduction to Volcanoes and earthquakes
