

English This half term our class novel will be based on Journey to the River Sea by Eva Ibbotson, Initially, we are going to take part in drama and oracy activities, then we will investigate new vocabulary, discussing word definitions to enable us to use these to compose sentences. After this, we will be investigate imagery and figurative writing skills, using expanded noun phrases to prepare us for some descriptive writing. In spelling, punctuation and grammar, we will learn spelling rules, conventions and patterns. We will consolidate our understanding of conjunctions and subordinate clauses as well as practising using parenthesis and cohesion.

We will write a piece that describes a tropical rainforest in South America. We will use our new vocabulary to describe the sights and sounds of life in the rainforest.

In guided reading we will study a selection of poetry, non-fiction and fiction texts and these will help us to write with maturity and flair.

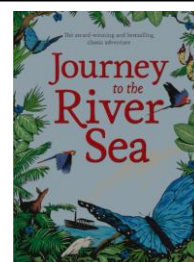
French
