


English - our flashback fiction text is *Eye of the Wolf* by Daniel Pennac. This fascinating narrative connects two fictional tales: one about a boy named Africa and the other about a captive Alaskan wolf with a single eye, named Blue Wolf. The connection between the two characters is uniquely conveyed through a powerful device—eye contact, through which the boy and the wolf communicate without words.

Throughout this term, children will engage in writing across a variety of genres, including poems, informational texts, recounts, balanced arguments, flashbacks, news reports, stories, biographies, persuasive letters, diaries, and narratives told from different perspectives.

In addition, we will explore a diverse range of texts, excerpts, and poems to analyse how authors employ various literary techniques to captivate and entertain their readers.
