

English - Our flashback fictional text is **Eye of the Wolf** by Daniel Pennac.

Two allegorical stories, one of a boy named Africa and one of a captive Alaskan wolf who has only one eye, Blue Wolf, merge through a unique device: the boy and wolf communicate solely through eye contact.

Children will write from a range of poems, information texts, recounts, balanced arguments, flashbacks, news reports, stories, biographies, persuasive letters and diaries.

Other studies this half term:

Various texts, extracts and poems to discuss how authors use a range of techniques to engage the reader and entertain.

Computing (Spreadsheets)

Children will use the 2simple tools create spreadsheets to represents information in a two-dimensional grid of data, along with formulas that relate the data.
